Please feel free to contact any of the Committee members to discuss club matters and to have those matters raised at a Committee meeting. The Committee meets on the first Wednesday of each month.

MONTHLY COMPETITIONS:

The monthly competitions start in January and will run on the same basis as 2016. ALL entries, both print and digital must be submitted on the club website *no later than midnight on the Sunday before each Wednesday competition*. The website is ready to accept your entries for as far head in the year as you want. You can always change entries later if you want to.

If you have any difficulty entering monthly competitions please contact Colin Woods. However, do not expect Colin to solve your problems at 10 minutes to midnight on a Sunday – please try to get your entries uploaded at least a week ahead of the closing date.

To enter a monthly competition just select For Members>Competitions from the menu, then select the category you want (such as "Enter Large Print Competitions"). Then select the month and category (such as "January Advanced Nature Large Print") and upload your images as you did last year.

SET SUBJECTS:

The Set Subject competitions are entered under the "Enter EDI-Digital Competitions" link. The definitions for each of the Set Subjects for the year are:

A BREAK IN PATTERN (January) – Judge Chris Prior

The image should contain a pattern and something that breaks the pattern, ie: a box of sharp pencils with one tip broken, or all facing one way except for one facing another way. The break in the pattern should create a focal point.

NATURAL ROCK POOL DISCOVERIES (February) - Judge Colin Schofield

Images of rock pools - no human elements, could be the whole pool, vegetation or inhabitants.

CREATIVE (March) – Judge Peter Stanley

A picture using more than one image, layer or filter to create an artistic version, with the aim of enhancing the original.

HUMOUR (April) – Judge Diane Schofield

The author should focus on human and/or animal behaviours/body language/expressions, demonstrating a humorous situation. Emphasis must be placed on the live subject.

AUSTRALIAN NATIVE FLORA (May) – Judge Jill Helps

An image that shows the unique and special characteristics of all or part of an Australian native plant, flower or tree. It does not have t be growing in the wild but it does have to be native/indigenous to Australia.

COUNTRY ROADS (June) – Judge Bev Woodman

There needs to be a strong emphasis on the road and it needs to be obviously in the country not a town or city area. However, the image can include fences, trees, creeks, crops, animals, people, buildings, etc. and may be gravel or sealed.

SET SUBJECTS Continued:

STOP AND THINK (July) – Judge Roy Killen

Images of scenes, signs, people, or anything else that caused the photography to think seriously about what they were seeing and possibly to ask themselves a question such as "What is that?", "Why is that happening?", "Why would anyone do that?", "Is this the future of the planet?", "Are people that crazy?". The key thing is that the image must also make viewers (and the judge) stop and think.

PORTRAIT OF ONE OR TWO PEOPLE (August) - Judge Alex Hunter

A portrait of one or two people that shows something of their personality and is preferably taken in interesting lighting. If there are two people the image must emphasise the interaction between them.

FOOD (September) - Judge Suasan MacNeill

Images may include traditional still life capture of food and the enticement to prepare and consume. The category allows for the incorporation of people or animals involved with food to tell a wider story; however, the focus of the image must remain with the food. Some examples are children enjoying a dripping ice cream, street photo of an Asian butcher's window, a chef preparing a meal, or food prepared and styled to showcase its colour, patterns or natural state.

INTO THE LIGHT (October) - Judge Bill Chambers

Also known as "Contre-Jour", this genre of photography has the main light source (e.g the sun) positioned behind the subject. It can encompass 'back-lighting' / 'rim-lighting' / translucence / lens flare / rays of light / silhouette / mist / cloud. Although just shapes or silhouettes are acceptable in this definition, images that show this form of lighting used to advantage will score higher than purely silhouette - unleash your creativity! [Generally, your theme/subject should be visible in some detail (lit frontally as well)].

BLUE MOUNTAINS & MT WILSON EXHBITION - Bev Woodman

Each year Phil and I put together an exhibition in the Blue Mountains at Mt Wilson to raise money for the local Rural Fire Service. We have just completed the fifth year of exhibitions and it is open to all photographers, painters and other artists. This year was a huge success with over \$41,000 raised and almost \$10,000 of art sold. This was the first year that we had the works judged and it proved very popular. I managed to encourage two of our members to enter, Peter Armstrong and Alan Daniel with Alan receiving a Highly Commended and also selling one piece of the four he entered. I am trying to encourage members to make the trip up the mountains next autumn (April is best) to capture the magnificent autumn colours and to photograph something for next year's exhibition that will be held on the 23rd & 24th September 2017. The exhibition weekend also includes open gardens (6 that participated handed their gate takings back to the event), food, activities i.e. Landscape Photography Course, Native Flower or Bird Walks and Ikebana or floral art.
