GRADING CHANGES

A new grading system is operating for 2016. Please refer to the email sent to all members by Roy Killen on 8th November, and also the information on the club website.

CONGRATULATIONS

Congratulations to Roy Killen who was presented with the Grand Master of APS (GMAPS) based on his record of acceptances and awards in international competitions.

He was also presented with the APS Nature Medallion that recognises photographers who have made an outstanding contribution in the field of nature photography. This medallion has been presented on 13 times in the 53 year history of APS; it was last presented in 2010.

The citation for the award stated that it recognised Roy as a "masterful nature photographer who was ranked 10th in the world by the Photographic Society of America in its Who's Who in 2014". However, the award was "based mainly on the momentous work that Roy did in leading a group of Australian nature photographers in formulating an interpretation of the FIAP Nature Definition". This document was eventually put to FIAP by APS as a standard interpretation of their document and was the impetus for negotiations between FIAP, the Photographic Society of America and the Royal Photographic Society. These negotiations led to the adoption of a common Nature definition that became official on 1st January, 2015. The final paragraph of the citation stated "Without Roy's dedication, guidance and ability as a facilitator it may well be that the photographic world would still be waiting for a common Nature definition".

Well done, Roy!
