


There is a limit of 20 places. The cost is \$195 per person (PayPal link on the website). Please note that no catering will be provided.

August Set Subject - Creative Flash

Bill Chambers from our Advanced Grade will judge this month's set subject - Creative Flash

"Photographers often try to avoid the use of on-board flash as it can create harsh lighting. However. Flash can be very subtly used to lift shadows, reduce contrast and produce a very natural light. For this Set Subject, you can use off-camera flash, on-camera flash, multiple flashes, or coloured gels but you need to try to make the lighting look as natural as possible (possibly bouncing flash from an umbrella, wall, ceiling or diffusing flash."
