

JANUARY LONG EXPOSURE PHOTOGRAPHY - GREG Carruthers

"Your image must be in colour and show obvious use of extended shutter speed (long exposure). When you keep your shutter open for an extended period of time your image can take on a whole new transformation. Long exposure photography gives you the ability to capture movement creatively and make your image unique. Examples could include, Night-time urban city scapes showing light trails, Landscapes where bodies of water become opaque, star trails or light painting to just name a few."

Images will be judged primarily on the photographer's ability to produce a unique image by their obvious use of long exposure and creativity.

FEBRUARY

WHEELS - Susan Slack

Any type of physical wheels (no copies of artworks using a wheel). Wheels may be vehicular wheels, ships wheel, potter's wheel, Ferris wheel, flywheel, wheelchair wheels, roulette wheel, etc. I want a story that uses a wheel or wheels as the main element. Try to avoid simply static photos of wheels unless telling a story of a broken wheel for example.

MARCH

SEAGULLS IN ACTION – Colin Schofield

Members are required to photograph these birds in action – fighting, bathing, flying, catching food (even chips) etc. They must not be taken in a static position. Focus must be on the birds, so the bird must be very dominant in the image. The image must exclude people.

Colour and Nature Print competitions will encompass large prints across all three grades and small prints in two grades (A and B).

Entries are now open for Round 2. Each club member may submit one image in each category and you can do this in the same way that you enter images for our monthly competitions. Just look for the PSA Interclub competitions on the competition entry page of the club website.

All club members are invited to submit entries now for Round 2 in all sections (Open, Nature, Photojournalism and Photo Travel). Entries will close on 1st February. If you had an image selected for Round 1 (in any section) it cannot be entered in Round 2or 3 in the same section or a different section. To enter Round 2, follow the normal procedure for entering competitions and select the "upload" link for the competition you want to enter. If you see that your entry from Round 1 has been automatically transferred to Round 2 you can leave it there or delete it and enter a new image.

If you submitted an entry in any category for Round 1 of the Interclub competitions and your entry was NOT selected to represent the club it has automatically been transferred to Round 2. You can leave the image there or you can delete it and replace it with another image. Entries for Round 2 close on 1st February, 2020. Please do not enter any image that was selected to represent our club in any previous Round of the PSA Interclub competitions in any year.


Greg's details can be found in the members link on the club website.


