

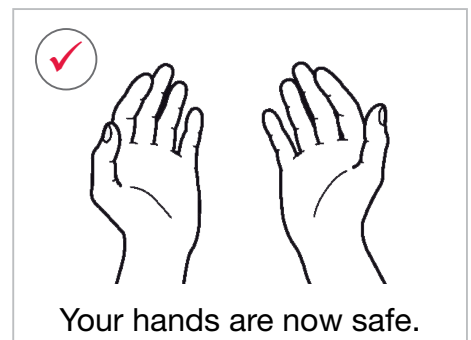
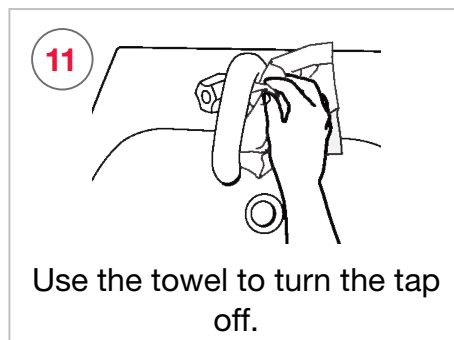
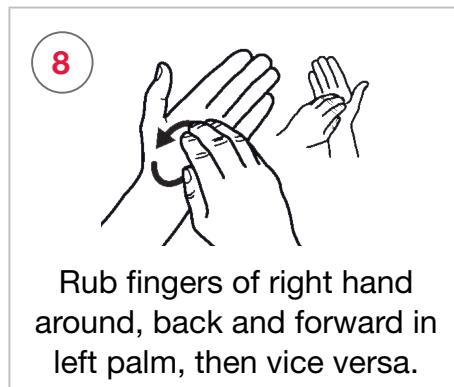
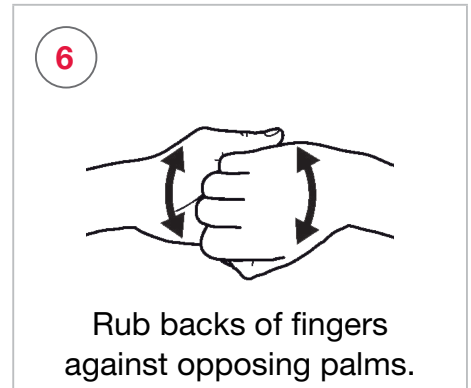


First aid fact sheet

How to hand wash correctly

The single most important action you can do to avoid infection is **washing your hands**.

- Wash your hands when they are visibly dirty. Otherwise, use an alcohol handrub liquid.
- Washing your hands should take 40–60 seconds.
