I will be leading the **Lighting Focus Group**. Since I primarily use flash in my projects, this group will focus on flash photography rather than LED continuous lighting, although we may sometimes work with both.

My goal is to equip participants with the foundational knowledge needed to confidently organise their own studio shoots. We'll have practical sessions to experiment with various lighting setups, as well as Zoom sessions for photo reviews and theoretical discussions. These practical sessions won't be pre-set workshops where you just press a button and get nice shots. Instead, we'll problem-solve together as a group, focusing on learning the principles of flash photography.

To help me plan effectively, I need to know how many people are interested and what level of experience everyone has. I'll be starting from the basics, so everyone is welcome to join, regardless of experience. Those with more experience might prefer to join at a later stage.

- Balancing flash and ambient light Neutralising ambient light
- TTL vs Manual
- Freezing motion with flash
- Creative flash effects
- Front curtain vs Rear curtain sync
- · Working with smoke and coloured gels
- 1, 2, 3 light setups Portrait, Fashion, Dance
